MARCH 2012: GOD IS THE RESTORER OF LIFE! "Give ear O Shepherd of Israel, You who lead Joseph like a flock. Stir up Your strength, and come and save us! Restore us, O God; cause Your face to shine, and we shall be saved!" (Psalm 80:1a, 2b, 3)

Our Lord God has always been the restorer of people and of life. To say that God is the restorer presupposes that folks have always been in need of being restored. The act of restoration goes far beyond something merely being given back to me, as I would restore an item I may have broken which had been borrowed. It is God's working to restore life in a person who is dead because of sin.

Our first parents, Adam and Eve were in need of our Lord's restoring power in their sad lives. Satan deceived them into questioning God's word and then in one act of sinful disobedience took and ate that which God had specifically told them not to do. Because of this one act of disobedience they were driven from the place of rest and peace to a world that was now harsh and unforgiving, truly a harsh reality. They went from having the Lord walk and talk with them in the garden to being separated from their loving Lord. However, God would not forsake them. His plan of restoration would begin to be unfolded.

The reality is that there are consequences to our flawed, sinful decision making processes. It is because of that first act of sinful disobedience that sin entered every person's life from Adam forward. It is because of that one sin that every person born is incapable of restoring life by their own strength or ability. To show how much this is so, scriptures teach; "There is none righteous, no, not one; there is none who understands; there is none who seek after God. They have together become unprofitable; there is none who does good, no, not one." (Romans 3:10-12)

It is for this very reason that the Psalmist calls us to look to God and Him alone to restore. God alone is the worker of true restoration. Satan and his domain are all about the destruction and death of God's creation. The Psalmist understood something which escapes many within the church today. He knew he could call upon God's presence and that would for sure do the saving of His people. The Psalmist also knew that his God was the covenant Keeper, unlike His people. The Bible shows that we have always been the covenant breakers. We are always standing in need of our Lord's restorative work in our lives. Thanks be to God, He loves us so! He will never turn away from His own.

Jesus, God-the-Son, is where a person can find complete restoration, a new life. Jesus reminds us; "Most assuredly, I say to you, he who hears My word and believes in Him who sent Me has everlasting life, and shall not come into judgment, but has passed from death to life." (John 5:24) The divine imperative is two-fold. "For all have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God." (Romans 3:23) And "by grace you have been saved, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, not of works lest any should boast." (Eph. 2:8&9) Jesus "is the way, the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father but by Me." (John 14:6)

Friends, allow the words of the Psalmist to penetrate our hearts; "Restore us, O God; cause Your face to shine, and we shall be saved! (Psalm 80:3) This must be important for it is repeated three times. As we humbly look to Him and trust Him, He will restore us, He will give us life and this life will be in abundance.

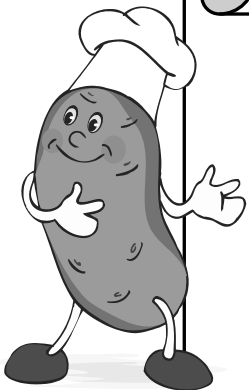
